

## Remembrance Day 11<sup>th</sup> November 2018



On Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> November, along with many other nations, we will be commemorating the ending of the Great War one hundred years ago. Four years ago our community gathered at the War Memorial to extinguish a light, and this year we shall relight this flame to signify light and hope.

Many organisations in the town will be joining together to mark this historic event. It is planned that the day will run as follows:

- 9.30 am: Service in St. Andrew's with an address from the Bishop of Tonbridge, the Venerable Simon Burton-Jones. Extra seating will be provided and the service will be relayed to the Winter Hall to enable as many people as possible to participate fully in the service.
- There will then be a parade to the War Memorial with the open air service leading up to 11.00 am as usual.
- Following the laying of wreaths the ceremonial lamp that was extinguished in 2014 will be re-lit and escorted back to the church.
- 6.30 pm onwards: gather in the church grounds.
- At 6.55 pm a bugler will play 'Sunset' in the church grounds.
- A gas brazier will then be lit outside the church as the bells are rung.
